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FOREWORD



FOREWORD BY PROF. DATO' DR. ADEEBA KAMARULZAMAN

CHAIRMAN OF THE MALAYSIAN AIDS FOUNDATION

2021 will be remembered as a turning point in our fight against COVID-19, the proverbial light at the end of the tunnel, as we finally took control of the pandemic that had sent our world into a tailspin at such breakneck speed and unimaginable intensity that many are still left reeling from the psychological, emotional and material damage that the pandemic had inflicted.

In drawing a parallel between AIDS and COVID-19, one must wonder how vaccines for COVID-19 were developed within 24 months while a vaccine for HIV remains elusive after 30 years of the discovery of the virus. The truth is – the success that we saw in the development of vaccines for COVID-19 was in no small measure driven by decades of research that went into HIV. The accumulation of scientific knowledge that turned HIV into a treatable chronic disease has in fact, accelerated our understanding about SARS CoV-2 virus and paved the way for rapid development of the life-saving vaccines.

This is precisely why we must continue to regard science and evidence-based approach as the cornerstone of our AIDS response 10 years ago – when we designed our national Harm Reduction Programme for injecting drug

users – it was based on science and the solid empirical evidence about where the HIV epidemic is concentrated and what needs to be done.

We now know with close to 100 % certainty that the antiretroviral or ARV therapy is capable to not only inhibit the HIV viral replication but stop onward transmission of the virus through sexual contact, as well as from a pregnant mother to her unborn child. These are the indispensable tools that can help us to eliminate the AIDS epidemic within our generation – provided that a critical masses of the PLHIV population, or at least 90 % of them, are receiving sustained ARV treatment that renders their viral load undetectable.

In MAF, we put great importance on this global goal to end AIDS. Despite the funding challenges and limited opportunity to carry out major fundraising events during the course of the COVID-19 pandemic, we never steered away from our responsibility to expand and improve access to ARV treatment. We were very determined to make sure that even structural barriers and socio-economic disparities should not stand in the way for PLHIV to access treatment. Our flagship treatment access programmes, namely the PAL Scheme and the Medicine Assistance Scheme, continue to offer subsidised ARV for the B40 community – a segment of our society hardest hit by the COVID-19 pandemic. We thank our long-standing partners, Yayasan Sime Darby, and new partners such as PERKESO, Philip Morris Malaysia and most notably, the Majlis Agama Islam Wilayah Persekutuan (MAWIP) and Majlis

Adat dan Agama Islam Perak (MAIPk) for sharing our mission to improve access to treatment.

In Sabah and Sarawak, our HIV treatment access programmes received a boost from Sunway Group who has committed a 5-year grant to support the operations of Teratak Kasih Tok Nan and the Sarawak Health Access Programme – both in Kuching – and the SAGA Health Access Programme in Sabah.

With cautious optimism, we were able to bring back our signature fundraiser, the Red Ribbon Gala and Sunway-MAF Tun Dr Siti Hasmah Award at the end of 2021. MAF is truly grateful for the incredible display of solidarity by our donors who continue to give generously to the cause despite the soft economic recovery period. Leading to the Gala, the MAF Secretariat continues to run a number of small but deeply meaningful fundraising initiatives and grant-making programmes for the benefit of the HIV community. Their efforts, led by the very capable Executive Director of MAF, Mr Jasmin Jalil, was truly remarkable during the tough pandemic period.

To all our donors, supporters and friends who have stood by us during these trying times – the Board of Trustees of MAF would like to record our deepest gratitude and thank you for your unwavering support.

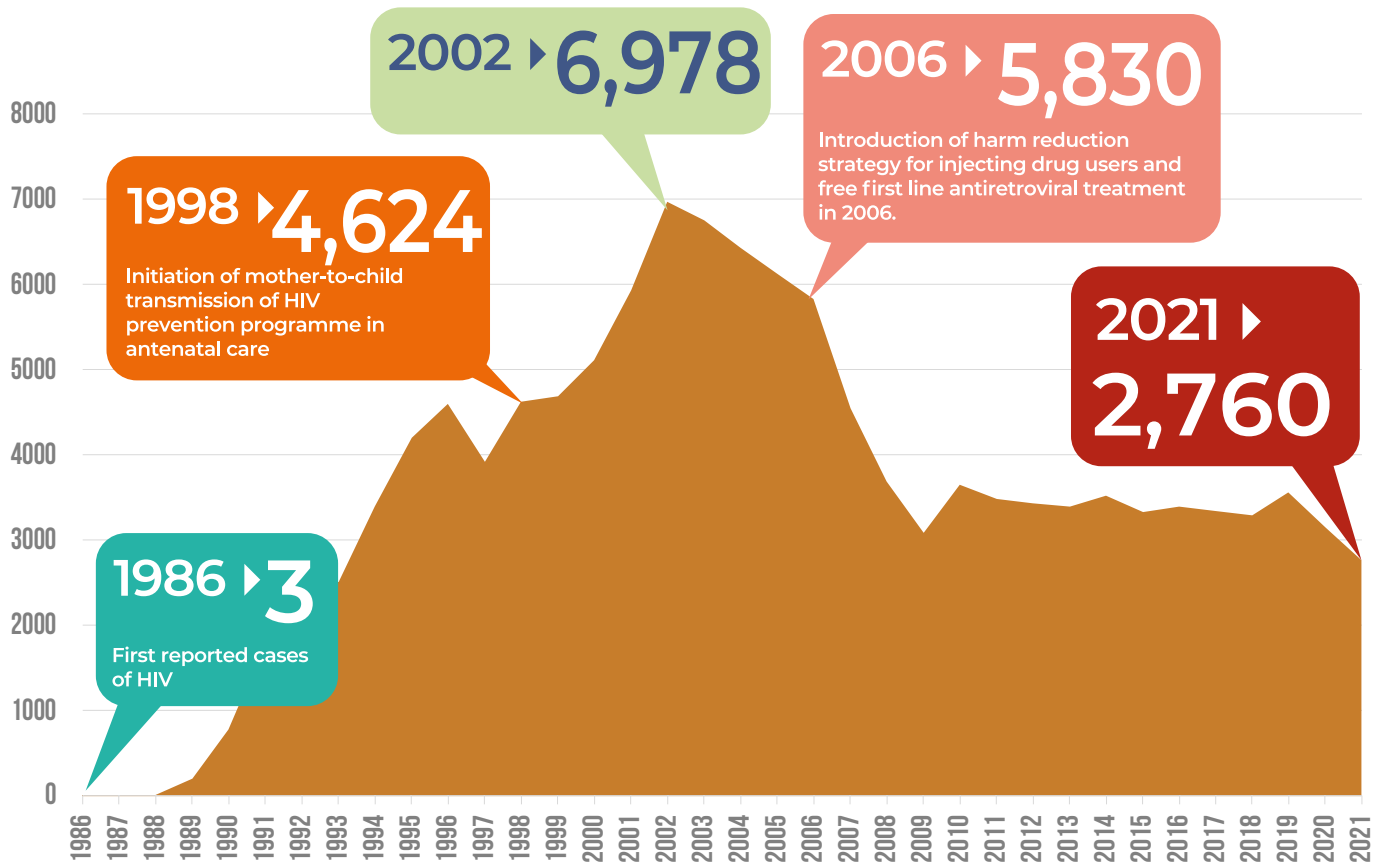

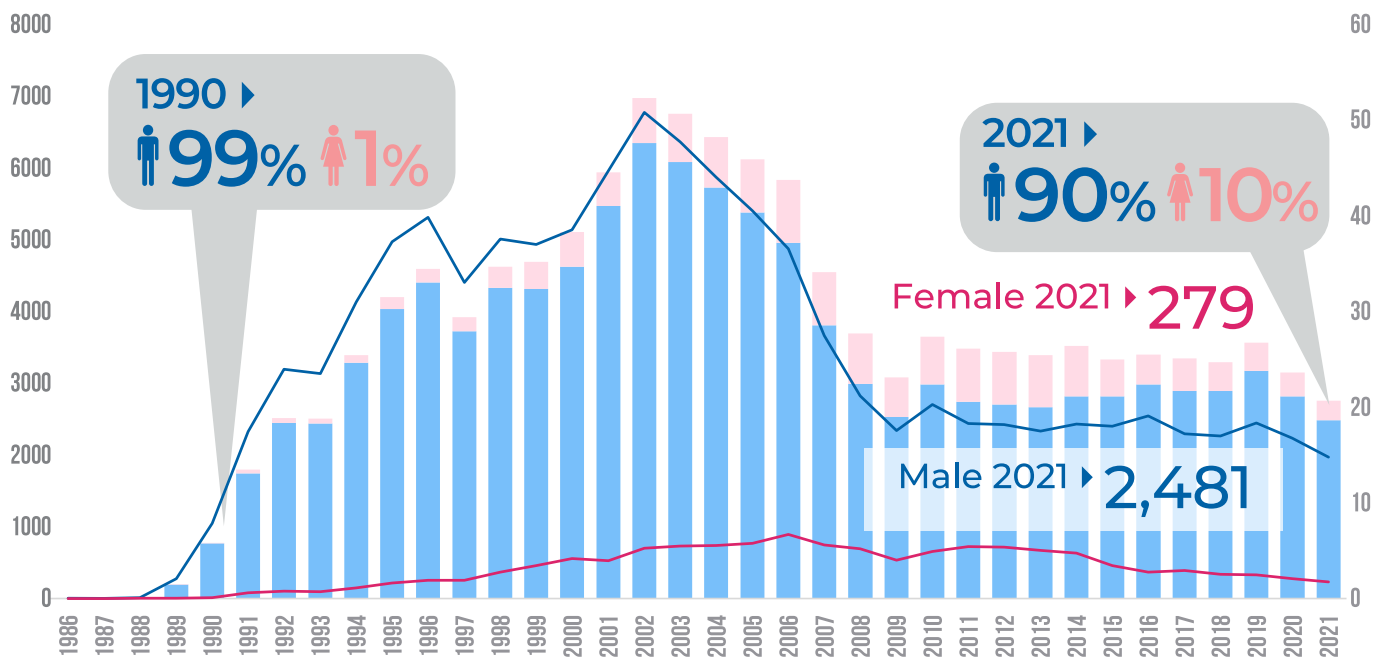
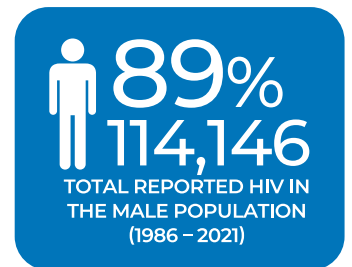
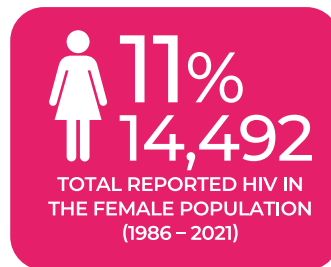
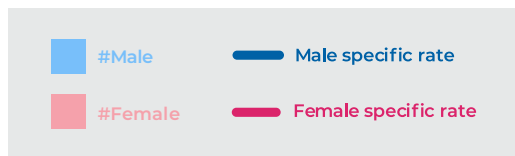

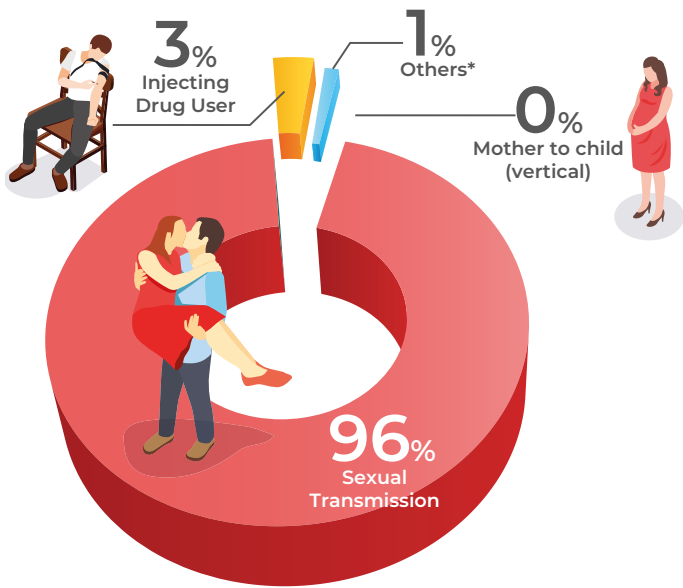
NEW HIV CASES (1986-2021)



HIV TRANSMISSION BY GENDER IN 2021



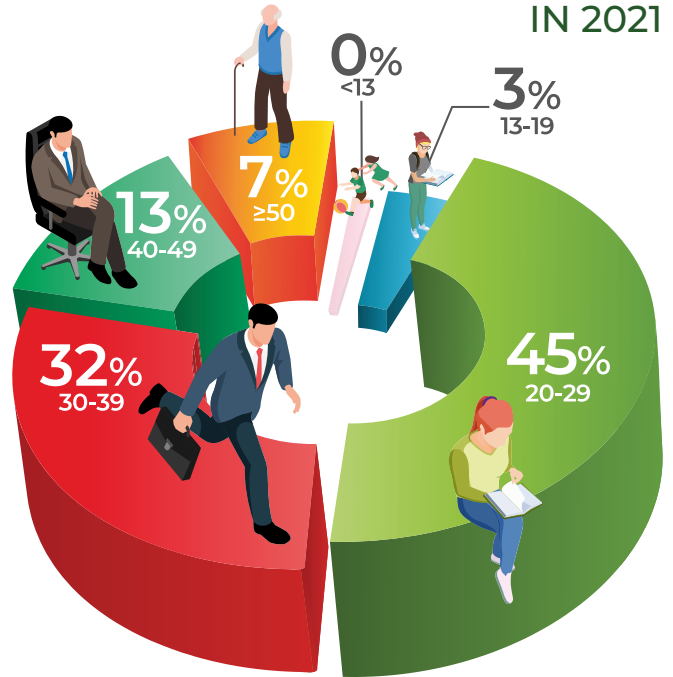
HIV TRANSMISSION BY RISK FACTOR IN 2021

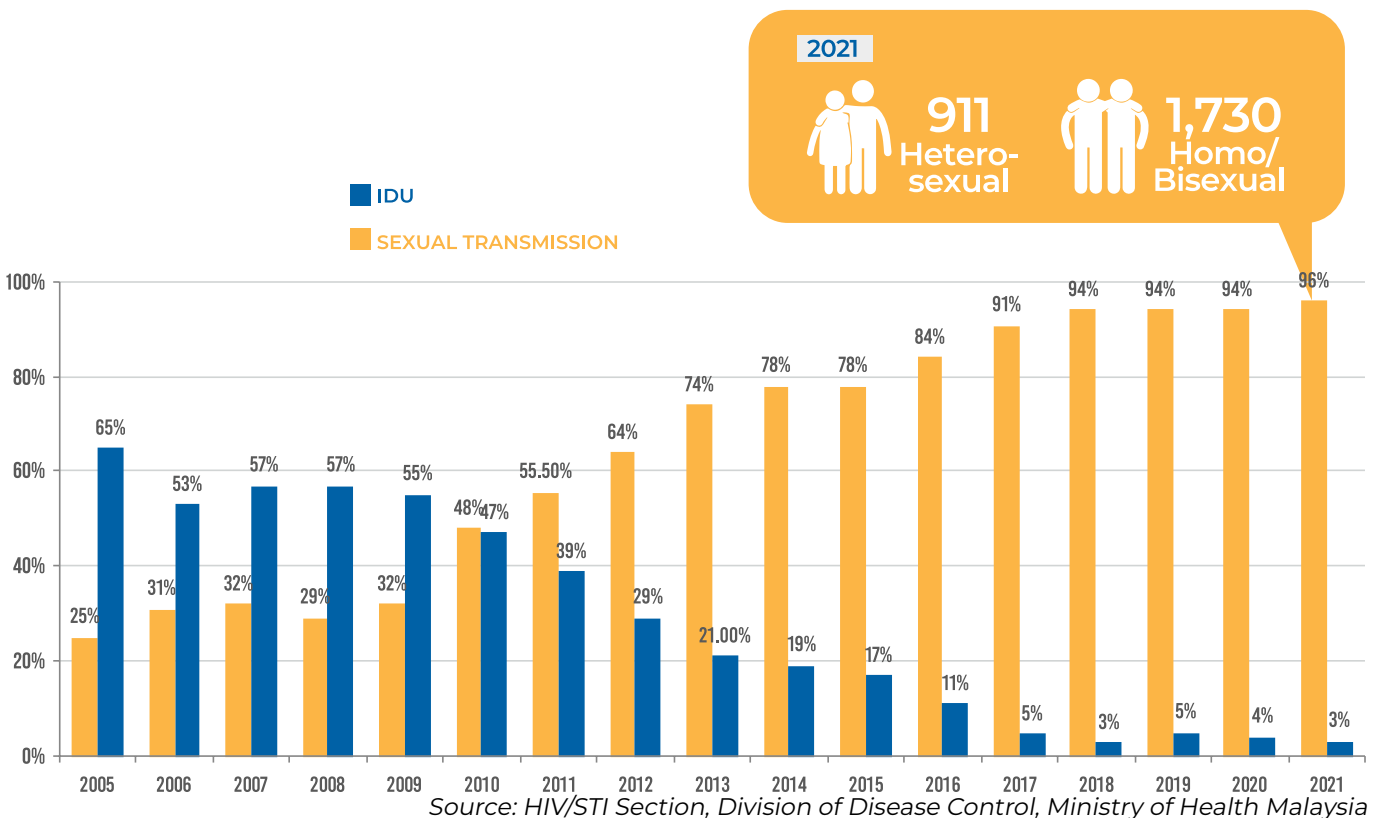

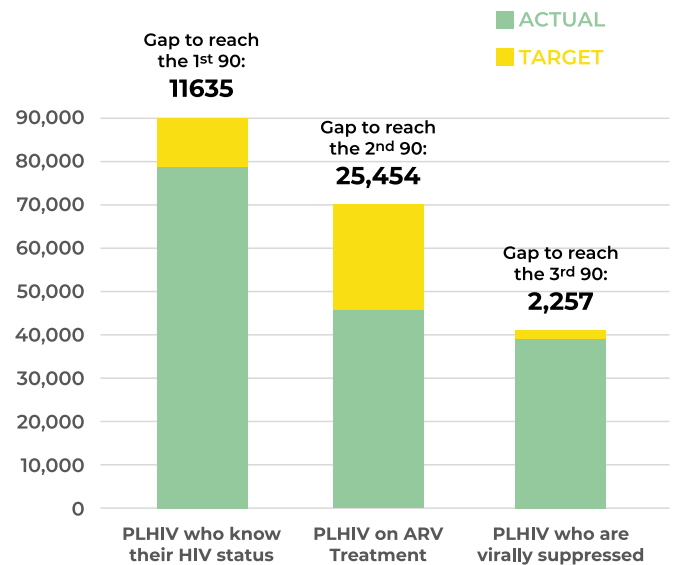

DR MAHANI NORDIN NAMED WINNER OF THE SUNWAY-MAF TUN DR SITI HASMAH AWARD 2021

DR. MAHANI NORDIN, THE AIDS OFFICER AT TERENGGANU STATE HEALTH DEPARTMENT, WAS HONOURED AT THE GALA AS THE WINNER OF THE COVETED SUNWAY-MAF TUN DR SITI HASMAH AWARD FOR 2021.



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She was recognised by the Jury for going beyond her call of duty to sustain the local community response to HIV/AIDS. She is one of the co-founders of Komuniti Cakna Terengganu, a community-based organisation that provides harm reduction services around needle exchange and methadone maintenance to people who use drugs as well as treatment, care and support to People Living with HIV (PLHIV).

On top of her co-founding role, she donated a piece of her own one-acre land to the organisation, where

a shelter home was built to help men who use drugs recover and integrate into society. A small plot of the same land has been turned into a community farm that allows the residents to attain their livelihoods through a social enterprise. She was also successful in her advocacy work with key state stakeholders, leading the Terengganu state government to designate a seven-acre land to expand Komuniti Cakna Terengganu's efforts and establish homes and facilities for men, women and children affected by HIV/AIDS.

RUNNING FOR A CAUSE

IN SOLIDARITY WITH THE PLIGHT OF PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV IN MALAYSIA



In 2021, MAF marked two major celebrations in the global HIV/AIDS calendar by organising virtual run events that helped to raise funds for Treatment, Care and Support Programme for People Living with HIV.

The inaugural MAF International AIDS Memorial Day (IAMD) Run was held from the 30th June until 31st July 2021. The IAMD is one of the oldest largest grassroots mobilisation campaigns for HIV awareness in the world. It is also the time of the year when the community around the world gather to pay tribute to families, friends and loved ones who have lost their lives to HIV and AIDS.

Towards the end of the year, MAF annual virtual run event, the 100,000 Steps to End AIDS, made a glorious return. The event was held between the 1st until 31st December 2021. The event was also the pinnacle of the MAF World AIDS Day celebration and it was officially endorsed by the Ministry of Health Malaysia.

MAF continues to enjoy the trust and support of many caring individuals and corporate donors who contributed to us even through the challenging pandemic period.

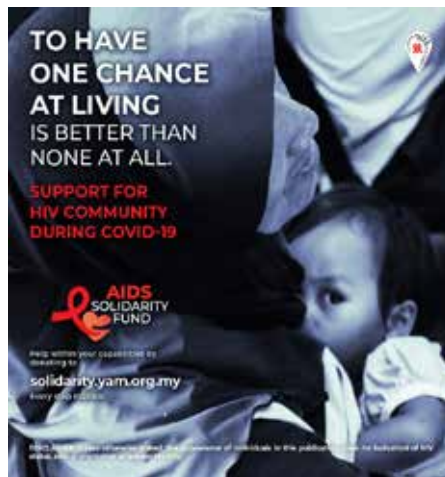

PARTNERSHIP IN ENDING AIDS

Our journey to end AIDS was accelerated by the support from major donors and CSR partners, some who have been supporting us for more than a decade and made a very significant contribution to the life-saving work that we do for the community of People Living with HIV.

YAYASAN SIME DARBY

YSD is the largest corporate sector donor to the HIV/AIDS programme in Malaysia, with a contribution in excess of RM 10 million made in the past decade.



ON-GOING SUPPORTS

3RD CYCLE OF PAL SCHEME GRANT RM 1.2 MILLION (2020 – 2022)

The grant funds the sponsorship of 2nd line ARV medication for 100 low-income PLHIV. The subsidised ARVs are prescribed and dispensed at 16 Government Hospitals across Malaysia. Support by YSD reflected their commitment to the National Strategic Plan to End AIDS by the MOH, which sought to achieve 95 per cent HIV treatment access rate by 2030.



ON-GOING SUPPORTS

3RD CYCLE OF LEADERSHIP IN ADVOCACY GRANT RM 950,000 (March 2020 – February 2023)



The grant funds the operational cost of a joint-advocacy secretariat for MAF and MAC, covering the salaries of three key team members who will work towards advancing the advocacy agenda spelt out under Malaysia's National Strategic Plan for Ending AIDS by 2030. Ultimately, the partnership aims to create a wider coverage of HIV prevention treatment, maintain long-term sustainability of AIDS response and reduce AIDS-related stigma and discrimination.

SUPPORT FOR PARTNER ORGANISATIONS

VEHICLE DONATION TO THE SABAH AIDS AWARENESS GROUP ASSOCIATION

YSD donated an 11-seater Hyundai Starex to support SAGA in their patient outreach programme under the SAGA Health Access Programme (SHAPE), which linked B40 HIV and other chronic disease patients from rural Sabah to life-saving treatment at Government Hospitals.

ON-GOING SUPPORTS

PAEDIATRIC AIDS FUND (PAF)



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PAF is a special assistance scheme that provides a monthly allowance of RM100 to underprivileged children aged 12 years old and below living with HIV or born into HIV-impacted families.

These allowances help affected families to purchase basic necessities like food and household items.

The allowance is dispensed using the Cashless Distribution System provided by our Community Partner, the MyKasih Foundation.

With funding by Berjaya Corporation Berhad, we were able to support 100 children under PAF.

YAYASAN PETRONAS

MAF and Yayasan Petronas are collaborating in 2 projects – the MyLady Assistance Scheme and the expansion of SAGA Health Access Programme (SHAPE).

ON-GOING SUPPORTS

MYLADY ASSISTANCE SCHEME RM 220,000 (2021-2022)



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The MyLady Assistance Scheme by Yayasan Petronas is a sustainability grant that supports Women Living with HIV in their entrepreneurial activities through a Microcredit Loan programme that comes with zero interest and favourable repayment terms. The loan is offered to 30 B40 beneficiaries and comes with comprehensive training and business mentoring programme.

SAGA HEALTH ACCESS PROGRAMME (SHAPE) RM 172,000 (2021-2022)

Following the successful early rollout of SHAPE by the Sabah AIDS Awareness Group Association (SAGA) in the East Coast of Sabah, Petronas took part in this treatment access programme by supporting travel subsidy to hospitals for 180 B40 patients diagnosed with HIV, Thalassaemia and childhood diseases.



SUNWAY GROUP

In 2021, MAF and Sunway Group established a special partnership designed to address the socio-economic barriers to HIV treatment, prevention and care services in Sabah and Sarawak.

ON-GOING SUPPORTS

MAF-Sunway HOPE Borneo Project RM 4.12 million (2021 – 2025)



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Support by Sunway to the tune of RM 4.12 million over the span of five years covers the cost to run three flagship programmes under this umbrella initiative, namely the Teratak Kasih Tok Nan and Sarawak Health Access Programme, both serving the HIV community in Sarawak, and the SAGA Health Access Programme for Sabah.

The three projects are important to plug the gaps that are preventing progress towards ending AIDS, especially in Sabah and Sarawak, where access to HIV medication

is more often than not, shaped by poverty and geographical vulnerability. Long distances to clinics, travelling barriers and the lack of integrated care which requires People Living with HIV to obtain treatment for co-morbidities in multiple treatment settings are the consequence of disproportionate distribution of health services in both States.

The project is expected to benefit close to 500 beneficiaries in Sarawak, and about 250 in Sabah.

M.A.C COSMETICS

Established in 1994, M.A.C Cosmetics is the largest non-pharmaceutical corporate donor in the world. MAF has been the beneficiary of the M.A.C AIDS Fund for more than a decade. Collectively, support by M.A.C AIDS Fund for the year benefited 460 members of key affected populations and vulnerable PLHIV.

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The HIV/AIDS community was also not spared from the flash floods that struck in December 2021. A number of our HIV/AIDS Support Centres and shelter homes in Kuala Lumpur, Selangor and Pahang had suffered the same fate. Operations were disrupted, properties destroyed, communities displaced and, in many instances, residents had to be evacuated to safer places. The Centres are operated by the Partner Organisations of the Malaysian AIDS Foundation.

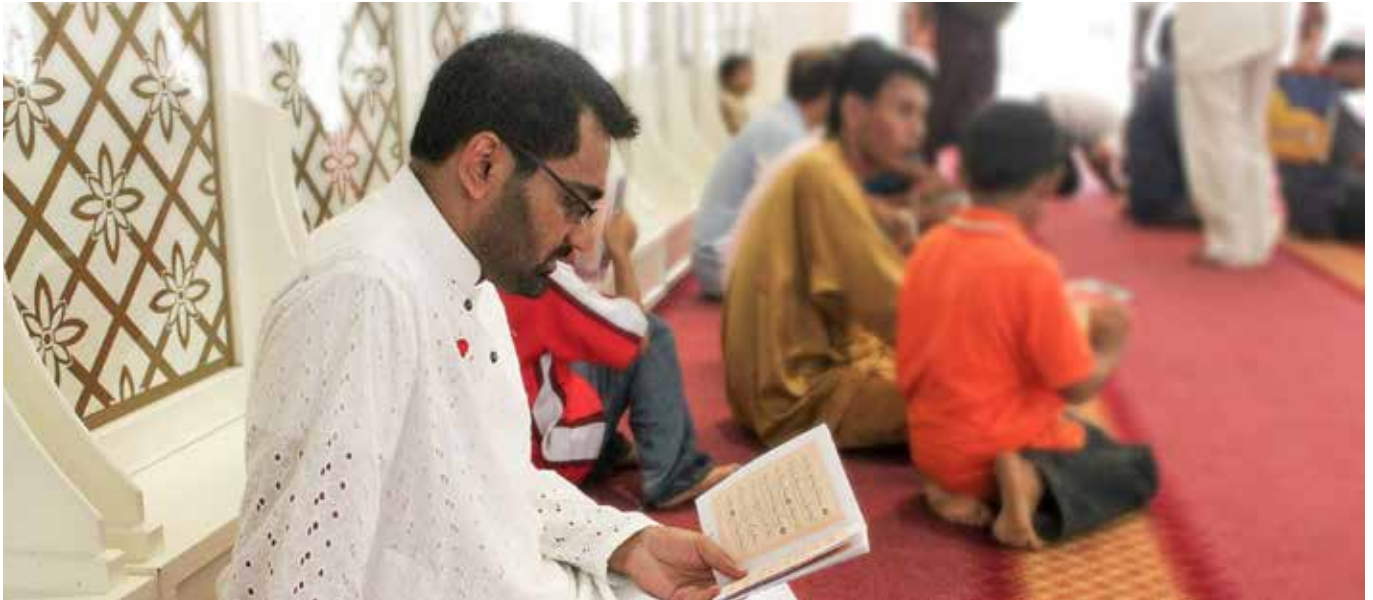
These Centres lie at the heart of our HIV/AIDS response. They are the epicentre of our Harm Reduction and HIV prevention programmes

for key affected population, and at the same time, also function as a one-stop support centre for our community – providing diverse range of services such as counselling, peer support programme, and even as tuition centre for children of the HIV/AIDS community – all amidst a safe and secure environment, free from stigma and discrimination.

Immediately, in the aftermath of the flood, an emergency relief fund were released by MAF to the affected Centres in order to facilitate their cleaning up. Komited Malaysia and SEED Malaysia each received RM4,000 from MAF.

HIV & ISLAM

A collaboration with the Federal Territory Islamic Council (MAIWP) and Perak Islamic Religious and Malay Customs Council (MAIPk) in the HIV Medicine Assistance Scheme programme was launched in October 2021.

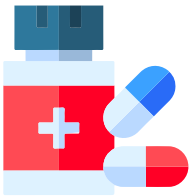

PERKESO – MAF COLLABORATION

PERKESO and Malaysian AIDS Foundation are collaborating in Prevention and Disability Management Program to establish a comprehensive program in delivering PERKESO benefits to eligible People Living with HIV (PLHIV), specifically in terms of prevention, rehabilitation, and employment services.



SOCSSO provides funding of second line Anti-Retroviral Treatment (ART) for a group of PLHIV. This funding is one of the efforts to prevent PLHIV from complications of HIV disease that can cause disability and inability to work.



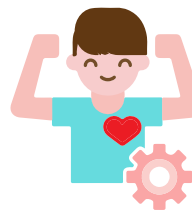

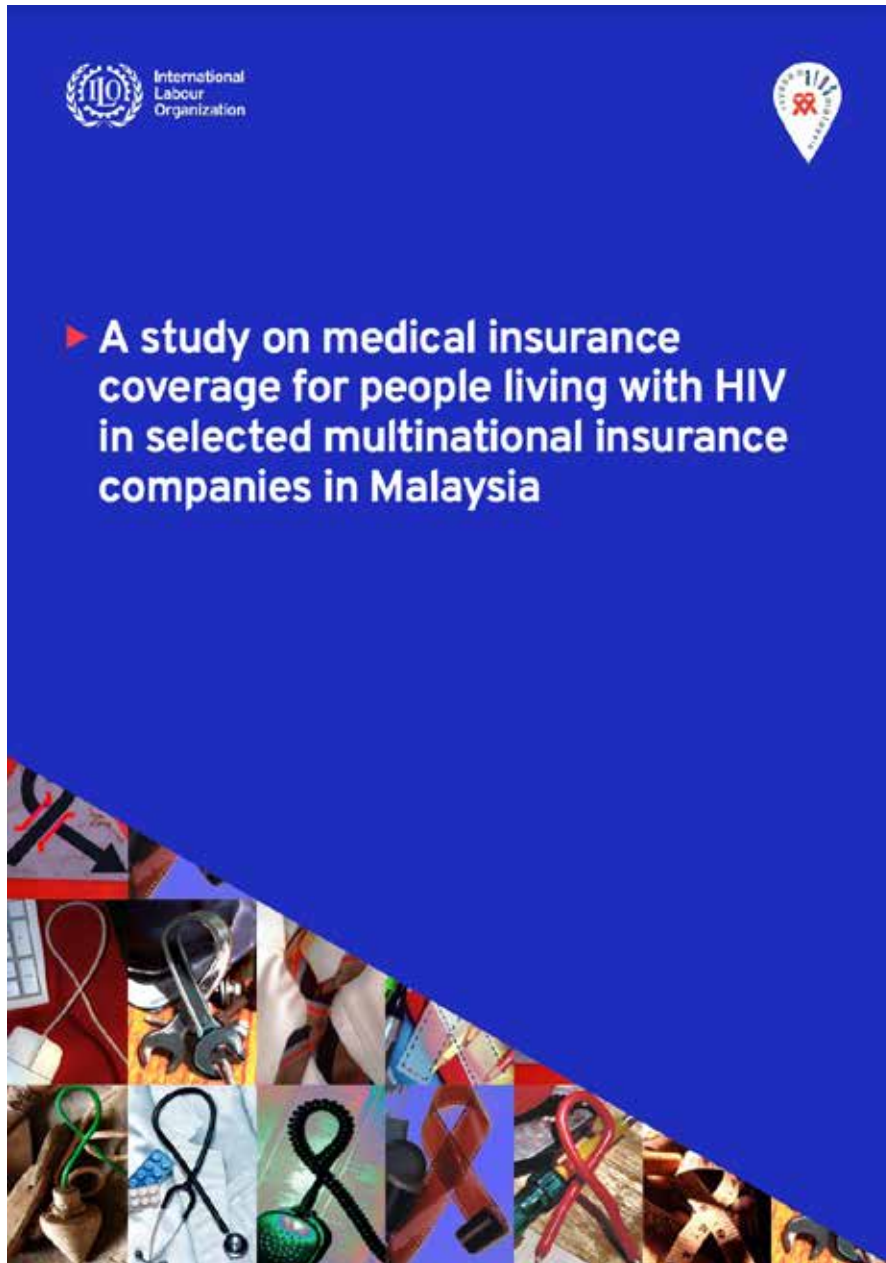

ILO-MAF MEDICAL INSURANCE RESEARCH REPORT

AN ADVOCACY INITIATIVE UNDER THE MALAYSIAN BUSINESS CONSORTIUM ON HIV/AIDS



HIV and HIV-related illnesses are excluded from private medical and health insurances in Malaysia. PLHIV are denied insurance coverage because of their pre-existing condition and there are no insurance policies that specifically cover HIV and AIDS in Malaysia. This is despite the fact that

the parent companies of some insurance companies in Malaysia provide coverage for People Living with HIV in other countries.

This predicament impacts PLHIV in different ways. Not only can they not purchase private insurance, but those who may have purchased private medical

and health insurance prior to their diagnosis experience challenges in attempting to make claims even when they have been contributing toward the premiums.

To counter the prevailing negative sentiments against PLHIV in the insurance industry, MAF and the International Labour Organisation (ILO) have undertaken a comprehensive study that provides evidence and makes a compelling argument for inclusion of HIV in public and private health insurance not just in Malaysia but in other parts of the world.

The report was launched at a webinar simultaneously held in Kuala Lumpur and Geneva on 6th May 2022. The launch was presided by Professor Dato' Dr Adeeba Kamarulzaman, Chairman of MAF, and Mr Afsar Syed Mohammad, Senior Technical Specialist ILO Programme on HIV/AIDS and the World of Work.

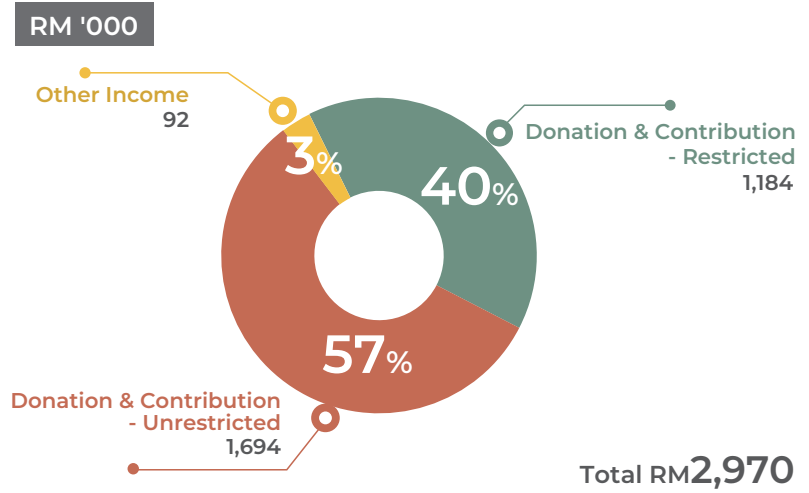
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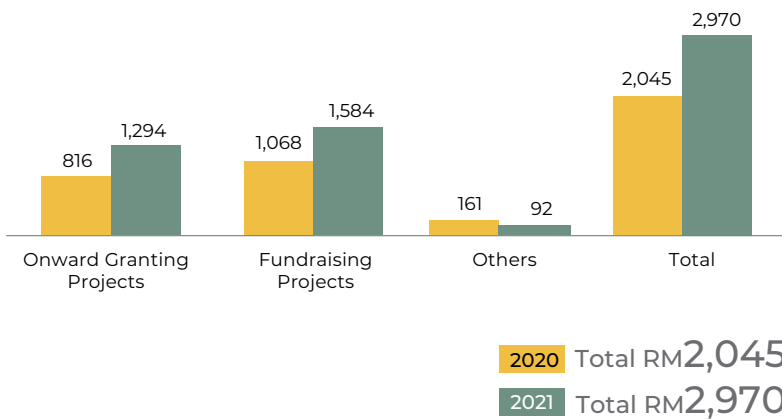

REVENUE

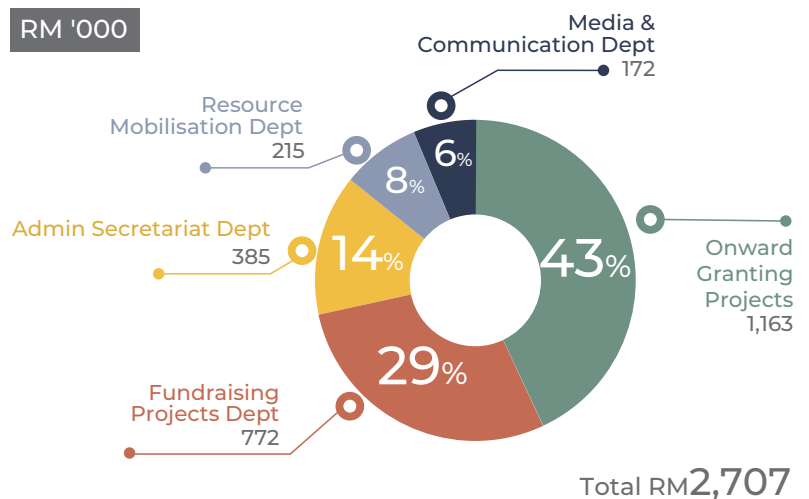
