2022 marked a significant milestone in the post-COVID recovery period as we emerged from the worst of the pandemic that has affected us all in numerous ways.

Our healthcare system has returned to its near normal capacity, enabling public hospitals to once again prioritise and carry out critical medical procedures that had been postponed during the pandemic's peak.

A sense of relief swept through the HIV fraternity when data revealed no significant difference in COVID-19 mortality rates between HIV-positive and HIV-negative individuals. This finding further validates the potency of antiretroviral (ARV) and the positive impact of viral suppression on the overall health outcome of People Living with HIV (PLHIV).

This achievement demonstrates the resilience of the Malaysian HIV response, even in the face of the most challenging times. MAF extends its heartfelt appreciation to the Ministry of Health (MOH) for their unwavering commitment to providing uninterrupted access to ARV treatment for PLHIV at all government primary care facilities during the COVID-19 crisis. We also

express gratitude for their efforts in fast-tracking the vaccination process for PLHIV.

Despite the economic fragility in the post-pandemic era, MAF is thankful that our work continues to receive the trust of regular donors and new partners. The Malaysian AIDS Foundation - Sunway Red Ribbon Gala stands as a clear testament to this outpouring of support. The event raised a record-breaking amount of RM2.5 million, the highest in MAF's history. We extend our deepest thanks to Tan Sri Dato' Seri Jeffrey Cheah and Sunway Group for their role as the Title Sponsor of this prestigious event and the incredible generosity of Monospace Group, Berjaya Corporation Berhad, and many other donors.

MAF continues to put HIV treatment at the front and centre of our plan for the long-term sustainability of the AIDS response.

At an individual level, HIV treatment significantly improves the health outcomes of PLHIV. By restoring and maintaining their immune system, ARV reduces the risk of opportunistic infections and HIV-related complications. Access to sustained treatment helps reduce the incidence of AIDS-related

illnesses, hospitalisations, and premature deaths, contributing to overall improved well-being and quality of life for PLHIV. Furthermore, by consistently taking prescribed medications, individuals can suppress the replication of the virus in their bodies, reducing their viral load to undetectable levels. This approach, often referred to as "U equals U" or treatment as prevention, is effective in curbing the spread of HIV and achieving epidemic control.

Our overarching commitment towards HIV treatment and prevention has given us a clear direction for engagement with corporate partners and donor organisations. Investments by major donors were all directed by MAF towards creating a robust foundation for HIV prevention, testing, treatment, and support services. We are incredibly grateful that our donors and supporters are aligned on what is important and urgent in the national AIDS response. This is evident in the decade-long support from Yayasan Sime Darby, our Official Strategic Partner for PAL Scheme and the HIV/AIDS Advocacy Leadership Grant, among others.

Similarly, Sunway Group is also positioning their CSR investment as part of their commitment towards ESG through their multi-year grant that helps B40 patients access treatment for HIV and chronic diseases. We also extend our special thanks to Yayasan PETRONAS, SOCSO, MAIWP, Yayasan Petronas, and many other corporate and individual donors who have supported us. Our journey to ending AIDS would not have been possible without them.

I want to thank our Patron, Datin Paduka Marina Mahathir, for her guidance and wisdom. I also appreciate the hard work and dedication of my fellow Board of Trustees, my Malaysian AIDS Council (MAC) counterparts, our Red Ribbon Celebrity Supporters and Members of the Press. 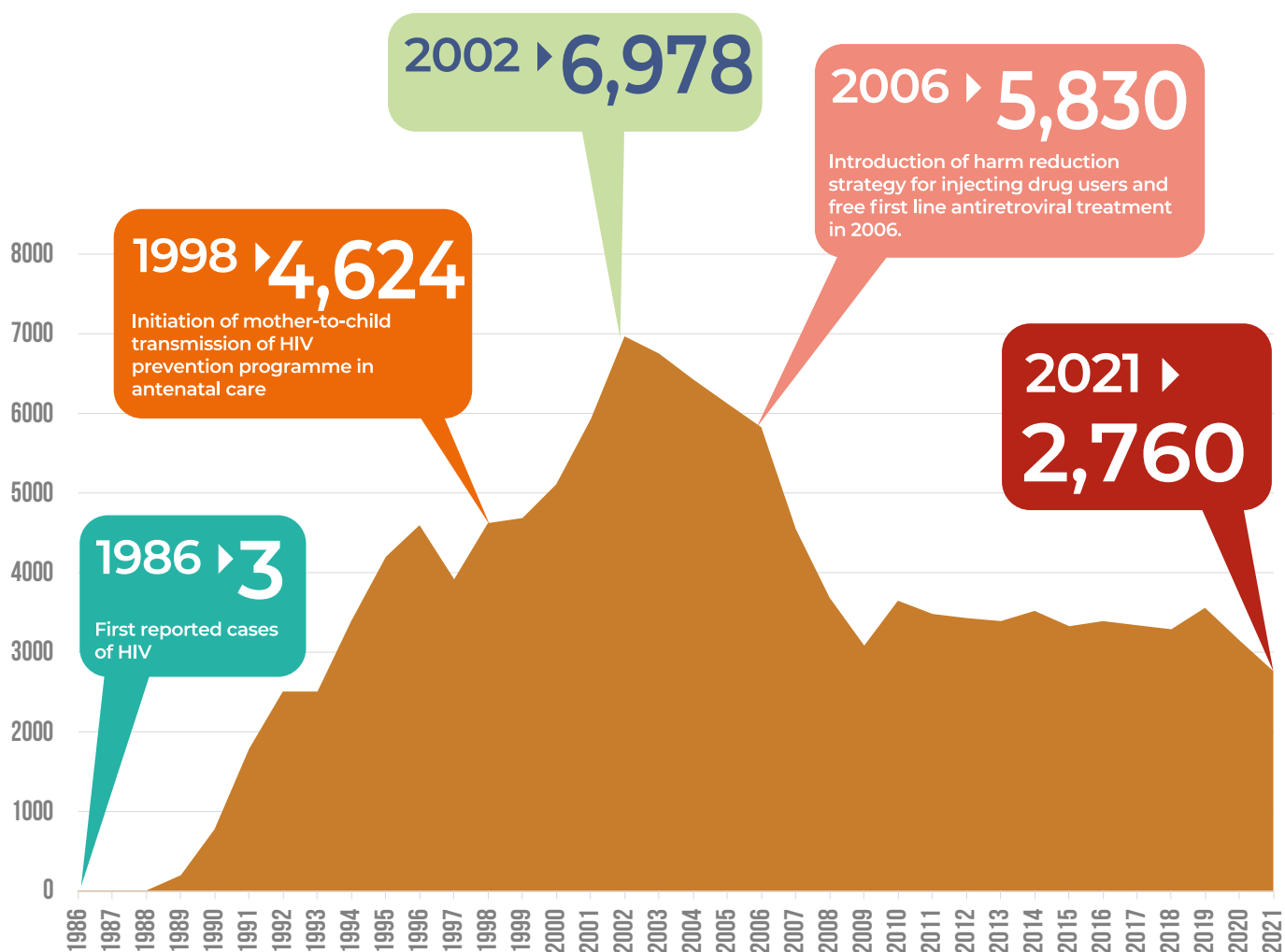

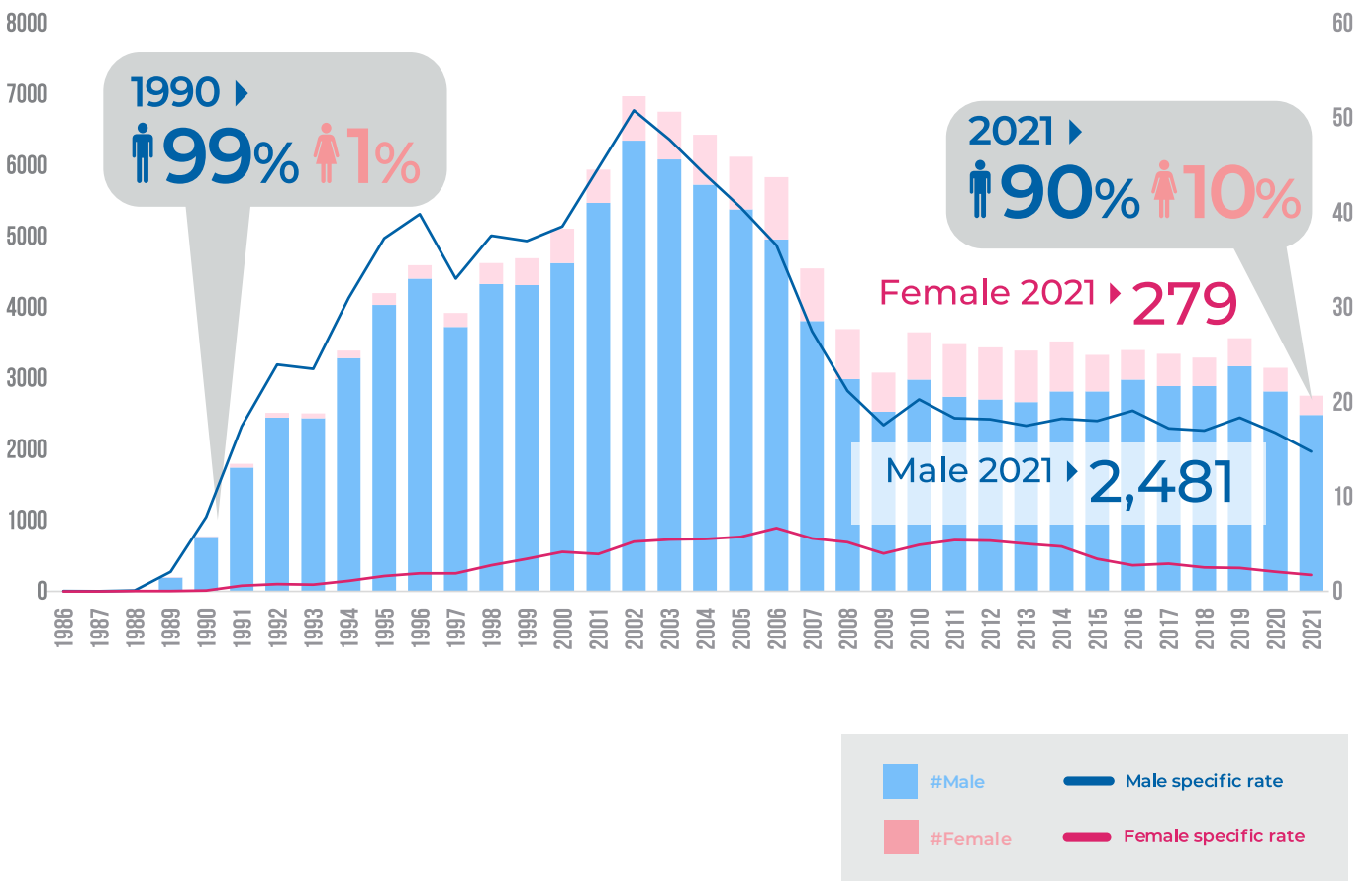
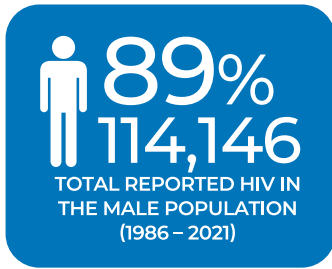
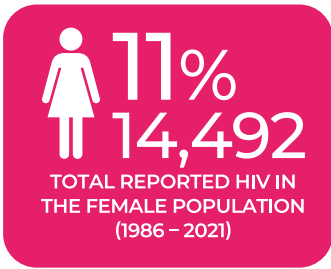

New HIV Cases (1986-2021)

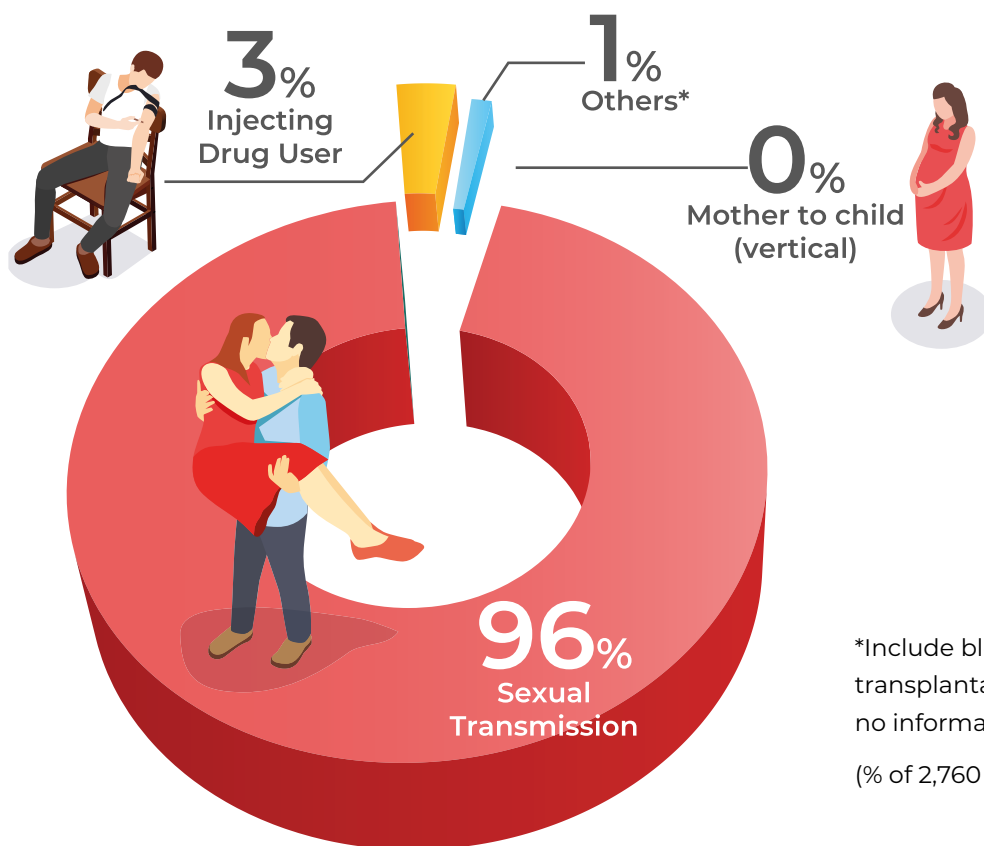


HIV Transmission by Gender in 2021



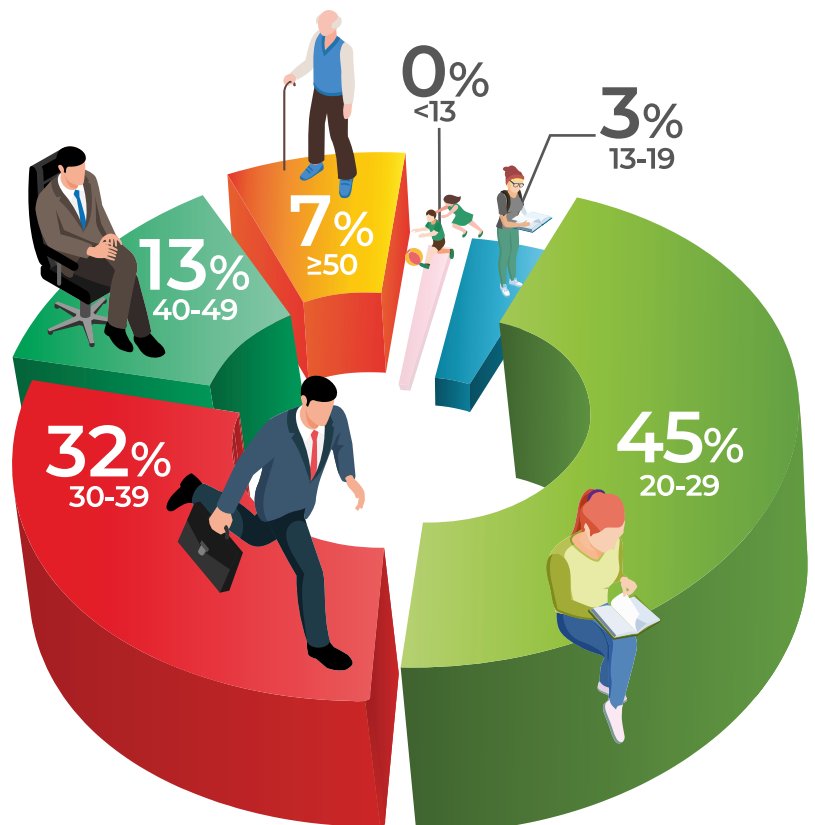

HIV Transmission by Risk Factor in 2021



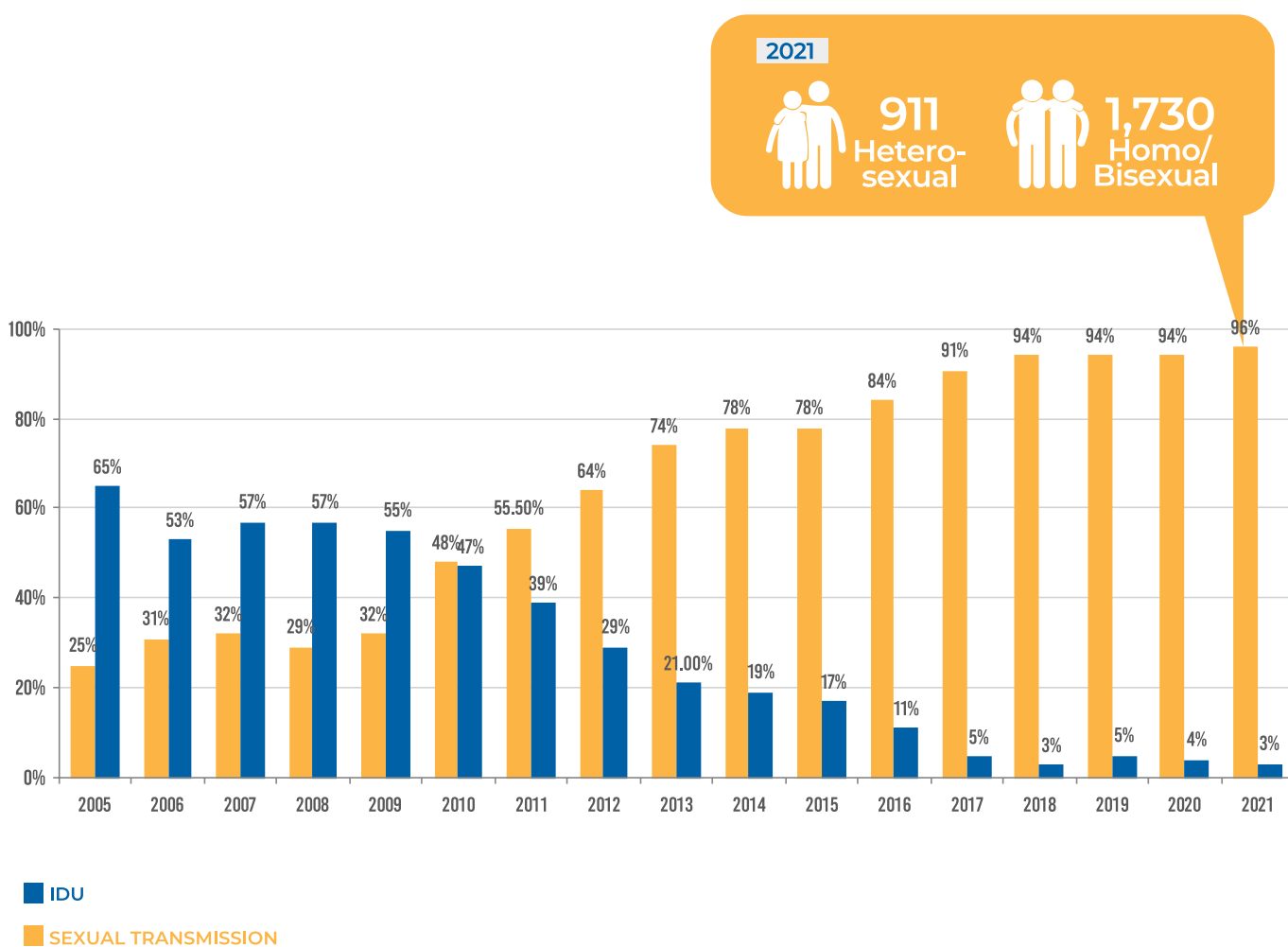

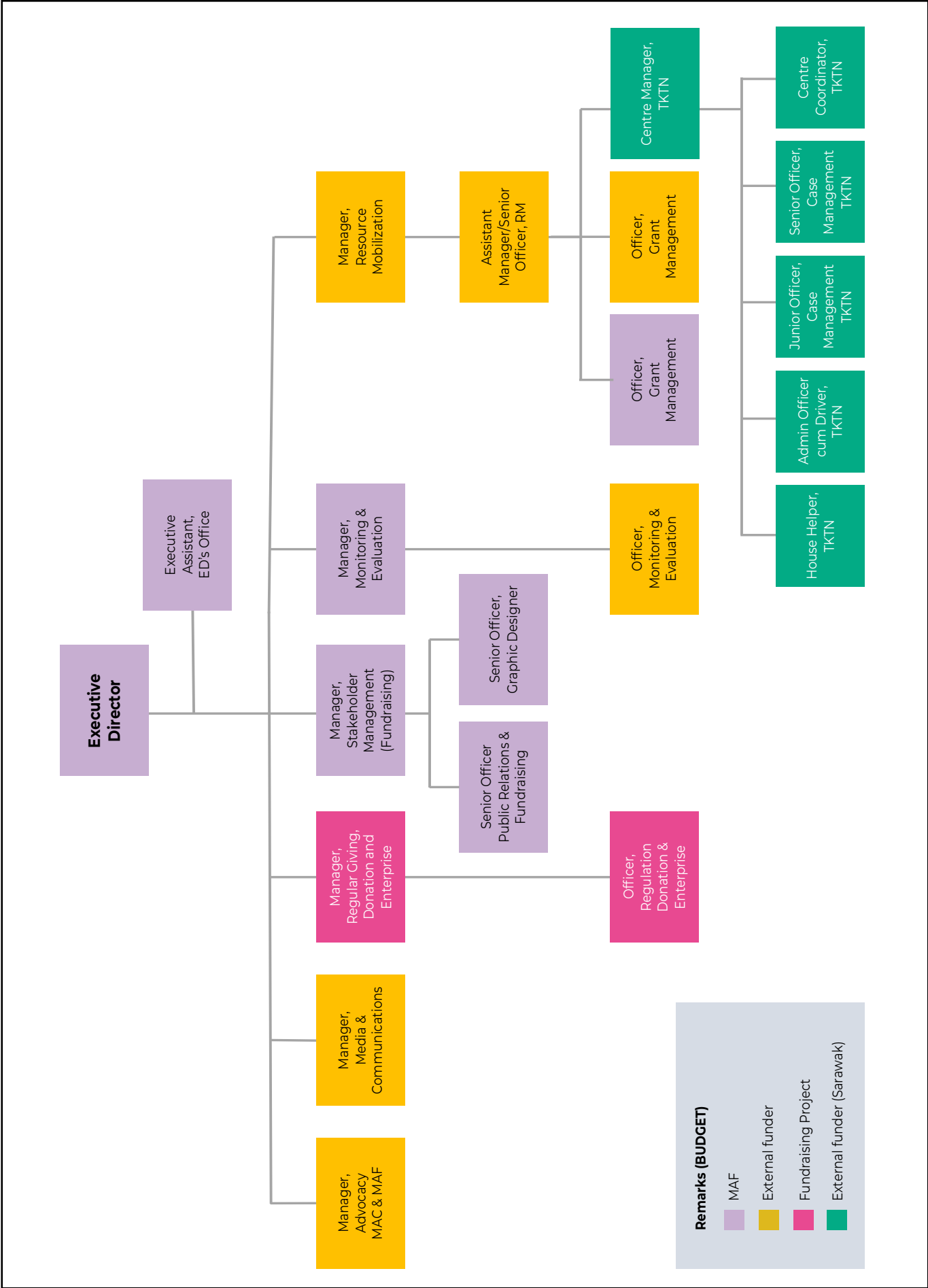

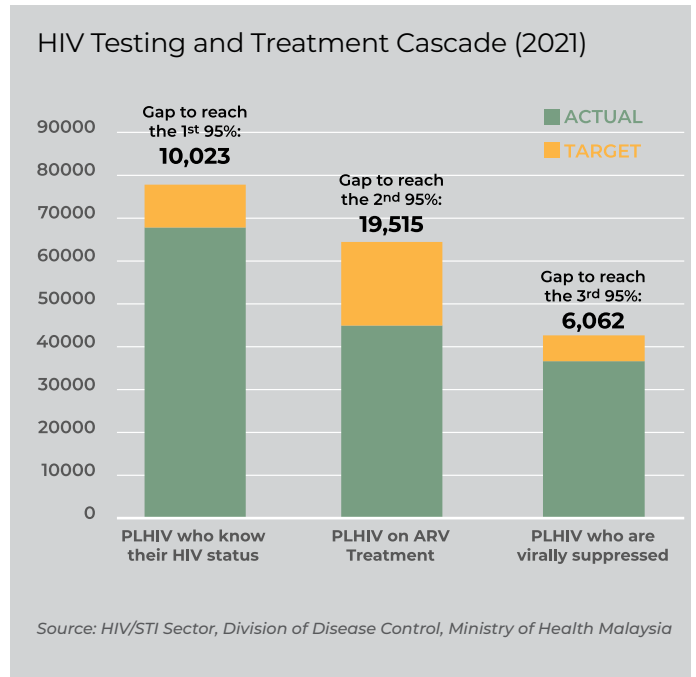

SUNWAY-MALAYSIAN AIDS FOUNDATION RED RIBBON GALA 2022



MAF successfully raised RM2.55 million at the Sunway-Malaysian AIDS Foundation Red Ribbon Gala and Sunway-Malaysian AIDS Foundation Tun Dr. Siti Hasmah Award. The event took place at Sunway Resort in Bandar Sunway, Petaling Jaya.

In her speech, MAF Chairman, Professor Dato' Dr. Adeeba Kamarulzaman, expressed her gratitude for the unwavering support of dedicated individuals and organisations to the HIV/AIDS cause. She also emphasised the need to maintain the right level of financial investment to ensure the momentum in the Ending AIDS progress is not lost.

Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr. Jeffrey Cheah, Gala Honorary Chair, Founder and Chairman of Sunway Group, highlighted the urgent need to ensure that no one is left behind in the fight against the HIV epidemic. He acknowledged the role played by Sunway Group in addressing

the epidemic while emphasising the importance of partnering with MAF to find effective solutions for Malaysians affected by HIV.

Themed "Sustainability in the AIDS Response", the Gala focused on MAF's strategic direction in making HIV and AIDS an SDG target for Malaysia. It symbolised the collaborative efforts between MAF and Sunway Group, guided by the SDG target of Ending AIDS by 2030.

of adversity, those affected by HIV/AIDS eagerly turn to Raffi'e as their trusted confidant and mentor.

JEFF LAU ARCTIC ULTRA CHALLENGE 2022



The Jeff Lau Arctic Ultra Challenge 2022 was a hugely demanding race for our dedicated youth volunteer and elite ultramarathoner Jeff Lau, 31, who faced formidable obstacles and setbacks during the Montane Lapland Arctic Ultra race.

The Montane Lapland Arctic Ultra is renowned as one of the toughest ultra races globally, posing immense physical and mental challenges to participants. The race required Jeff to complete a gruelling 500km ultra marathon while pulling a 30kg sledge containing food and gear. The challenging conditions, including temperatures as low as -20°C , had to be overcome within a 10-day timeframe.

Jeff participated in the race with the goal of raising funds for the Paediatric AIDS Fund, a special programme by MAF that focuses on supporting children living with or affected by HIV, enabling them to thrive through education and social assistance.

Upon completing the race, Jeff expressed gratitude for the opportunity to raise funds for a cause that is close to his heart. Despite the hardships and the initial reluctance to participate in similar races again, Jeff found satisfaction in knowing that his efforts contributed to improving the lives of others.

MAF AT THE 24TH INTERNATIONAL AIDS CONFERENCE IN MONTREAL



The 24th International AIDS Conference was held from July 29 to August 2, 2022 in Montréal, Canada, helmed by Professor Dato' Dr. Adeeba Kamarulzaman, MAF Chairman, who also holds the position as the President of the International AIDS Society.

More than 13,000 HIV professionals and members of the civil society were presented the opportunity to engage in a dialogue about the current progress and future of

the HIV response. The conference theme – “Re-engage and follow the science” – was reflected in numerous sessions that provided updates on global progress towards ending the HIV and AIDS pandemic by 2030, as well as cutting-edge research on HIV cure strategies, treatment and prevention.

MAF was represented by its Executive Director, Mr Jasmin Jalil, the Head of Operations, Mr Mohd Razif Zainuddin and the Manager of Resource Mobilisation, Mr 'Abdullah Salam.

Most notably for MAF, our participation in the Conference has led to international recognition of our HIV and Islam initiative, where HIV fraternities from Alliance Ukraine, Eastern Europe and several Central Asian countries have engaged with us to learn about our unique harmonisation of religious ideology with the principle and practices of harm reduction.

Yatela Zainal Abidin, consultant obstetrician and gynaecologist Dr. Imelda Balchin, and Norlela Mokhtar, founder and chairperson of Persatuan Wahidayah Malaysia, highlighted the current situation.

Dr. Yatela referred to a recent study that showed only 17 per cent of women were represented on the boards and in senior management of over 900 public-listed companies in Malaysia, indicating the need for significant improvement in gender representation. She shared her

personal experience of gender and Hijab-related discrimination earlier in her career but highlighted the positive change that has taken place, leading to her appointment as the first female CEO of Yayasan Sime Darby based purely on merit.

Norlela emphasised the importance of gender equality at all levels of society, including corporate sectors, and discussed the challenges women face in accessing HIV treatment due to stigma. Dr. Imelda stressed the need for men's support in achieving gender equality and emphasised the importance of women in leadership roles working collaboratively with men.

Professor Dato' Dr. Adeeba addressed the obstacles faced by women in Malaysia, particularly the lack of childcare, which hinders their career progression. She emphasised the necessity of affordable childcare and various forms of support. While Malaysia aims to achieve 30 per cent women representation in decision-making roles by 2030, progress has been made in some sectors, but there is still work to be done across society to achieve gender equality.

In summary, the Webinar shed light on the importance of gender equality, the benefits it brings to organisations, the need for institutional support, and the encouragement for women to believe in themselves and demand change.

MERDEKA AWARD 2022

HEALTH, SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY
PROFESSOR DATO' DR ADEEBA KAMARULZAMAN



Professor Dato' Dr. Adeeba Kamarulzaman was the recipient of the 2023 Merdeka Award for Health, Science and Technology Category.

The Award marked another feather in the cap for Professor Dr. Dato' Abeeba's long and illustrious career as an academician, HIV/AIDS researcher and activist. She holds various key positions in prestigious global and regional organisations, including the UNAIDS Scientific Expert Panel and the WHO Strategic and Technical Advisory Group on HIV. In 2020, she became the first Asian President of the International AIDS Society.

Professor Dato' Dr. Adeeba was a professor of Medicine and Infectious Diseases at the University of Malaya where she founded the Infectious Disorders Unit in 1996. Under her leadership, it has become one of the top referral centres for HIV/AIDS and infectious diseases in

Malaysia. She also established the Centre of Excellence for Research in AIDS (CERiA) in 2008 which conducts vital research focusing on marginalised communities.

With her involvement in the Malaysian AIDS Council and the Malaysian AIDS Foundation, Professor Dato' Dr. Adeeba has promoted and implemented community-based HIV/AIDS programmes nationwide. Her efforts have led to a significant reduction in new HIV/AIDS infections through innovative initiatives like the Needle Syringe Exchange Programme (NSEP). Furthermore, Professor Dato' Dr. Adeeba played a crucial role in the national COVID-19 response in Malaysia. She was chair of the University Malaya Medical Centre (UMMC) COVID-19 Task Force, the National Recovery Council, and the Johor COVID-19 Health Advisory Committee. She is highly regarded as one of the Top 20 most influential female scientists in the Muslim World and has been profiled in prominent publications including The Lancet.



I think seeing the changes that have come about despite all the barriers and challenges keeps me motivated and of course seeing the successes in terms of the numbers of infections averted and seeing patients lead healthy and productive lives.”

GRANT MANAGEMENT PROJECTS



MEDICINE ASSISTANCE SCHEME



ARV treatment has shown significant success in controlling HIV infections, suppressing virus replication, preventing transmission, and protecting unborn babies. However, not all individuals living with HIV can fully access these benefits due to various challenges.

ARV treatment is an integral part of the long-term sustainability of AIDS response because treatment helps to reduce the vulnerability of PLHIV and enables them to embark on a journey towards recovery and leading normal lives.

The Medicine Assistance Scheme aims to support those living with HIV, particularly addressing barriers such as stigma, discrimination, socio-economic factors, and the high cost of second-line antiretroviral (ARV) medications.

PAL SCHEME



The PAL Scheme, funded by Yayasan Sime Darby (YSD), provides sponsorship for the 2nd line Antiretroviral (ARV) medication to support 100 low-income People Living with HIV (PLHIV).

The subsidised ARVs are prescribed and dispensed at 16 Government Hospitals throughout Malaysia.

This marks the 3rd cycle of YSD's grant support for the PAL Scheme, valued at RM 1.2million. The funding period began in 2020 and continued until 2022.

FEDERAL TERRITORY ISLAMIC RELIGIOUS COUNCIL EXPANDING THE MEDICINE ASSISTANCE SCHEME



MAF's partnership with the Federal Territory Islamic Religious Council (MAIWP) continues to flourish with another year of extension of support for the Medicine Assistance Scheme. A donation of RM 210,000 from zakat collections was presented by Dr Yusri Mohamad, a member of MAIWP, to Professor Dato' Dr. Adeeba Kamarulzaman, Chairman of MAF, in a ceremony at the MAF Headquarters.

The donation benefited 25 individuals from the Al-Riqab Asnaf group living with HIV in Kuala Lumpur.

SOCIAL SECURITY ORGANISATION (SOCSO)

2022 marked the second-year extension of their support to this life-saving programme. R M306,000 was committed this year to support 30 SOCSO members needing second-ARV treatment.

SOCISO's assistance to MAF is a natural progression of its dedication to safeguarding the rights of Malaysian workers, including PLHIV. Their endorsement of the Medicine Assistance Scheme demonstrated a strong belief in the potential and abilities of PLHIV to regain their health and actively contribute to society, thereby supporting the nation's progress.



SOCISO has already recognised AIDS-related complications as one of the 55 covered diseases within their healthcare benefits, ensuring the well-being of PLHIV individuals.

Additionally, their flagship programme, the Return-to-Work (RTW), assists PLHIV contributors

who have experienced injuries or illnesses, facilitating their recovery and enabling them to return to work sooner, prioritising their welfare and productivity.

LAUNCH OF MAF-SUNWAY BORNEO HOPE PROJECT



namely the Teratak Kasih Tok Nan and the Sarawak Health Access Programme, both serving the HIV community in Sarawak, and the SAGA Health Access Programme for Sabah. HOPE stands for Health Outreach Programme for Everyone.

The partnership was officiated on July 6, 2022 at Teratak Kasih Tok Nan by Sarawak Premier, Datuk Patinggi Tan Sri (Dr) Abang Haji Abdul Rahman Zohari bin Tun Datuk Abang Haji Openg. He was represented at the event by Dato' Sri Fatimah Abdullah, the Sarawak Minister of Women, Childhood and Community Wellbeing Development. The event culminated in a Cheque Presentation by the Founder and Chairman of Sunway Group, Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr. Jeffrey Cheah, to MAF Chairman, Professor Dato Dr. Adeeba Kamarulzaman.

MAF and Sunway Group have established a special partnership designed to address the socio-economic barriers to HIV treatment, prevention and care services in Sarawak and the neighbouring state of Sabah.

Officially known as the MAF-Sunway HOPE Borneo Project, support by Sunway to the tune of RM 1 million per year over the span of five years will cover the cost to run three flagship programmes under this umbrella initiative,



Remarks by Professor Dato' Dr. Adeeba, Chairman of MAF



“It is important for us to close the gap that is hindering progress towards ending AIDS, especially in Sabah and Sarawak, where access to HIV medication is more often than not, shaped by poverty and geographical vulnerability. Long distances to clinics, travelling barriers and the lack of integrated care which requires People Living with HIV to obtain treatment for co-morbidities in multiple treatment settings are the consequence of disproportionate distribution of health services.”

“We are grateful that Sunway has heeded our call for support to improve access to treatment and build on the success of Teratak Kasih Tok Nan that was initiated by our Patron in Sarawak, Datuk Amar Hajjah Jamilah Haji Anu, some 5 years ago.”

“Our belief that no one should be left behind is one of the fundamental reasons why Sunway is deeply committed towards advancing the sustainable development agenda. We have fully embraced the 17 Sustainable Development Goals, or SDGs, adopted by the United Nations in 2015. That includes a goal to eradicate the AIDS epidemic by 2030.”

“But let me be clear. We are not here to reinvent the wheel. Sunway’s role is to support and build on the good work of all our partners here today who have greatly contributed to this noble cause.”



TERATAK KASIH TOK NAN



Teratak Kasih Tok Nan's operations started in 2017. From its humble beginning as a halfway home for HIV patients seeking treatment at the nearby Sarawak General Hospital, the Centre has grown considerably over the years – turning into a comprehensive One-Stop Support Centre that caters to the needs of the HIV community in Kuching and beyond.

At the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, Teratak Kasih Tok Nan also served as a crisis centre that provides immediate relief to the local HIV community whose livelihoods were affected by the pandemic. In 2022, Sunway's support for Teratak Kasih Tok Nan has enabled us to provide support to more than 1,000 clients including their family members and dependencies.

SARAWAK HEALTH ACCESS PROGRAMME (SHAPE)



SHAPE is primarily offered to patients in the Kuching and Samarahan Divisions.

With the support of Sunway Group, we were able to emulate the success of the SAGA Health Access Programme in neighbouring Sabah which has been offering a similar financial scheme since 2019 in the East Coast of Sabah.

Starting from January 2022, a brand-new hospital travel subsidy programme for HIV and other chronic disease patients was introduced by MAF Sarawak.

Under the Sarawak Health Access Programme (SHAPE), cash subsidies starting from RM30 were offered to 200 individuals from the B40 background for every return trip for treatment at the local Clinics / Government Hospitals.

SABAH HEALTH ACCESS PROGRAMME (SHAPE)



Thanks to the generous support provided by Sunway, we have been able to extend our assistance through the Sabah Health Access Programme (SHAPE) to a significant number of individuals.

Specifically, we have been able to support a total of 250 patients hailing from the districts of Sandakan, Kunak, Lahad Datu, and Semporna.



MYLADY ASSISTANCE SCHEME



The MyLady Assistance Scheme is a sustainability grant that supports Women Living with HIV in their entrepreneurial activities through a Microcredit Loan programme that comes with zero interest and favourable repayment terms.

Yayasan Petronas is funding this Scheme that benefits 30 beneficiaries in Selangor, Terengganu, Kedah, Kelantan, Johor KL, Pahang, Perak, Sabah, Sarawak.

Beyond the financial assistance, the Scheme also provides comprehensive training and mentorship programmes designed to equip the beneficiaries with the necessary skills, knowledge, and guidance to grow their businesses successfully.

ADVOCACY & RESOURCE MOBILISATION



LEADERSHIP IN ADVOCACY GRANT



The Leadership in Advocacy Grant by Yayasan Sime Darby funds the operational cost of a joint-advocacy secretariat for MAF and MAC, covering the salaries of three key team members are integral to HIV/AIDS advocacy efforts aligned with the advocacy agenda spelt out under Malaysia's National Strategic Plan for Ending AIDS by 2030.

Ultimately, the partnership aims to create a wider coverage of HIV prevention treatment, maintain the long-term sustainability of AIDS response and reduce AIDS-related stigma and discrimination.

This is the third cycle of YSD's grant support for this initiative, which amounts to RM 950,000 over a period of three years. The current funding period started in March 2020 and will continue until March 2023.

TOWARDS ENDING AIDS BY MALAYSIAN BUSINESSES (TEAMB)



TEAMB, short for Towards Ending AIDS by Malaysian Businesses (TEAMB), is a specialised training programme developed by MAF.

Its main goal is to provide comprehensive guidance to employers to effectively address HIV and AIDS within the workplace. This innovative initiative aims to equip businesses with the necessary knowledge and resources to develop and implement robust policies that cover essential aspects such as non-discrimination, fair employment practices, management commitment, confidentiality as well as effective communication of information and prevention strategies.

Through the TEAMB programme, employers are empowered to take proactive measures and create an inclusive work environment that prioritises the well-being of their employees while addressing the challenges posed by HIV and

AIDS. By leveraging the expertise and guidance provided by TEAMB, businesses can establish solid policies and procedures that uphold the principles of equality and fairness and effectively mitigate the impact of HIV and AIDS on their workforce.

TEAMB is supported by the Department of Occupational Safety Health (DOSH) and Ministry of Health Malaysia, whose shared vision is aligned with the National Strategic Plan for Ending AIDS 2016-2030.

This emphasises the importance of a collective approach in combating the HIV and AIDS epidemic. Karex and Yayasan Sime Darby also back the initiative. All training conducted under TEAMB is claimable under the Human Resources Development Fund (HRDF).

The TEAMB inaugural training session took place on December 13, 2022 at DoubleTree Shah Alam I-City, a MAF Partner Hotel. The training was led by Mr Bakhtiar Talhah, the Honorary Secretary of MAF, a certified HRDF trainer and a corporate professional living with HIV for over 25 years. The workshop saw the participation of 30 individuals from 6 multinational companies (MNCs) and government-linked companies (GLCs).

HIV CONNECT



To effectively implement these changes, our esteemed partner, the Malaysian Society for HIV Medicine (MASHM), took proactive steps to update the online learning model to align with the new priority. As part of their comprehensive efforts, they organised a virtual workshop in July 2022, which was exclusively tailored for a select group of General Practitioners (GPs) who displayed a genuine interest in offering PrEP services or expanding their existing HIV services to incorporate PrEP as well. The workshop placed a strong emphasis on the practical aspects of establishing and operating a PrEP/PEP-friendly clinic.

During the workshop, participants were equipped with crucial clinical knowledge pertaining to PrEP/PEP, ensuring they have a comprehensive understanding of the medical aspects involved. Furthermore, they received valuable information regarding the procurement of PrEP drugs, which played a pivotal role in facilitating the provision of these services. In addition, the workshop facilitated peer networking opportunities, enabling participants to forge connections with other prescribers and Infectious Diseases (ID) clinicians.

HIV Connect is a joint initiative by MAF and the Malaysian Society for HIV Medicine (MASHM).

In 2022, the HIV Connect programme underwent a significant transformation in its focus and objectives in order to address the continued rise in sexual transmission of HIV.

The primary aim of this shift was to increase the number of healthcare professionals who are qualified to prescribe Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) and Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP). Recognising the pressing need for such services, particularly among key populations in urban settings, the programme sought to meet the growing demand for PrEP.

HIV & ISLAM HARM REDUCTION WEBINAR WITH ALLIANCE UKRAINE



The ISLAM & HARM REDUCTION International Webinar was jointly presented by the MAF and the Alliance for Public Health Ukraine (AU) on 13 December 2022. The webinar was supported by Yayasan Sime Darby and the Department of Islamic Development (JAKIM).

Malaysia's unique intersection between public health policy and Islamic values for harm reduction has gained international recognition and positioned the country as a respected global leader in this field.

This evidence-based approach, which included the Needle Syringe Exchange Programme (NSEP) and Methadone Maintenance Therapy (MMT), led to a significant decline in new HIV cases among injecting drug users. Malaysia's experience was shared at the Webinar with national Muftis and religious leaders from Central Asian nations and countries with substantial Muslim populations.

SOARING HIGH WITH THE MALAYSIAN AVIATION GROUP



In 2022, Malaysia Aviation Group (MAG), the parent company of Malaysia Airlines, joined forces with the Malaysian AIDS Foundation to enhance programmes focused on HIV/AIDS treatment, care, and support for those in need.

MAG generously offered complimentary air travel within Malaysia to essential personnel

and frontline workers involved in expanding HIV treatment, care, support, and advocacy efforts for communities affected by the epidemic.

Professor Dato Dr. Adeeba sincerely appreciated MAG's involvement and emphasised the partnership's significance in addressing challenges following the COVID-19 pandemic. She highlighted that this collaboration facilitated the mobilisation of resources for critical HIV/AIDS programmes, contributing to the ultimate goal of ending AIDS.

Meanwhile, Captain Izham Ismail, the Group CEO of MAG, underscored the importance of shared responsibility and reliable connectivity in supporting MAF's endeavours. This partnership aligns with their corporate social responsibility framework and sustainable development blueprint.

VEHICLE SPONSORSHIP BY BERJAYA CORPORATION BERHAD



MAF secured sponsorship of a 14-seater van this year courtesy of Berjaya Corporation Berhad. This invaluable support has greatly enhanced our ability to enhance connectivity and effectively serve our community. It signifies yet another milestone in our enduring partnership of over two decades.

The van was officially handed over by the Chief Operating Officer of Berjaya China Motor, Tan Say Tuan, to Mr Jasmin Jalil, the Executive Director of MAF, at their Showroom in Petaling Jaya.

FLOOD ASSISTANCE FOR COMMUNITIES AFFECTED BY HIV AND AIDS



The monsoon floods between December 2021 and early 2022 significantly impacted our Partner Organisations and HIV-affected communities in Kuala Lumpur, Selangor, and Pahang.

In response, MAF swiftly initiated relief efforts to assist over 200 clients affected by these floods. The floods resulted in extensive damage to the offices of our Partner Organisations as well as Drop-in Centres and Shelter Homes.

To alleviate the immediate financial burden, we provided cash aid amounting to nearly RM 20,000 to affected individuals. Additionally, we allocated RM 30,000 to SEED Malaysia and Komited Malaysia, enabling them to recover and refurbish their premises.

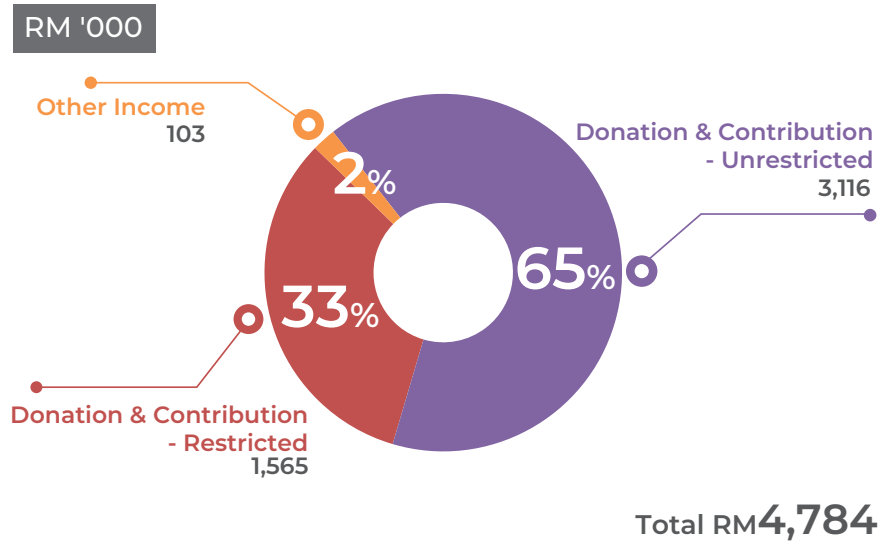

Simultaneously, the media aids us in education and outreach to our target audience with vital information about HIV treatment and prevention.

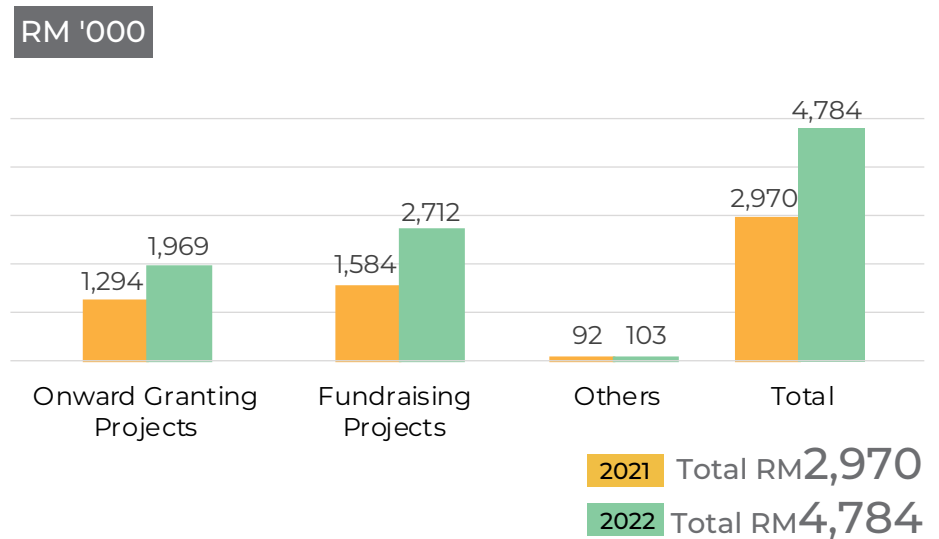

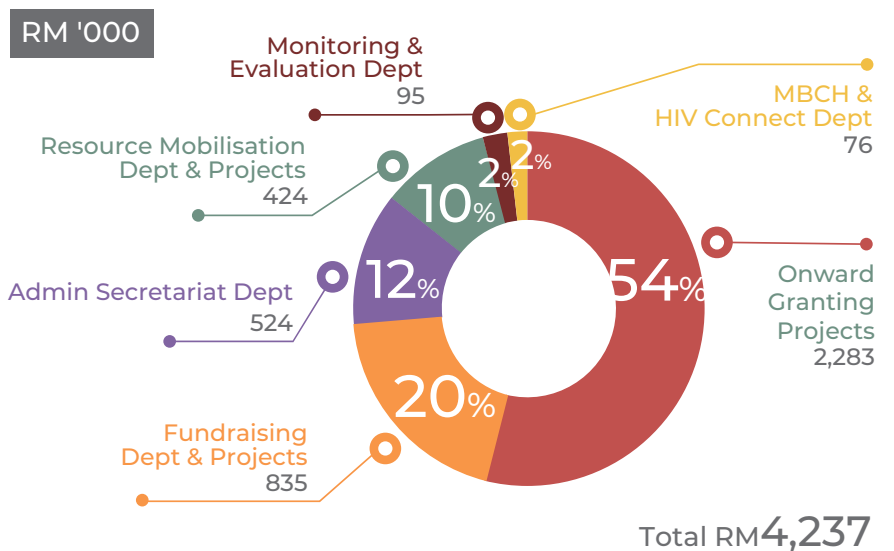
REVENUE
